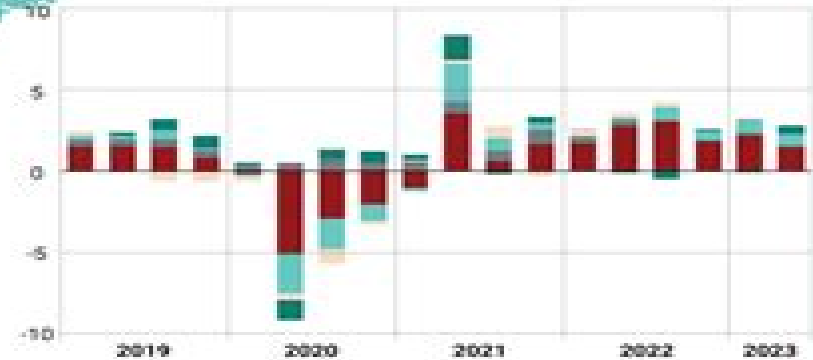

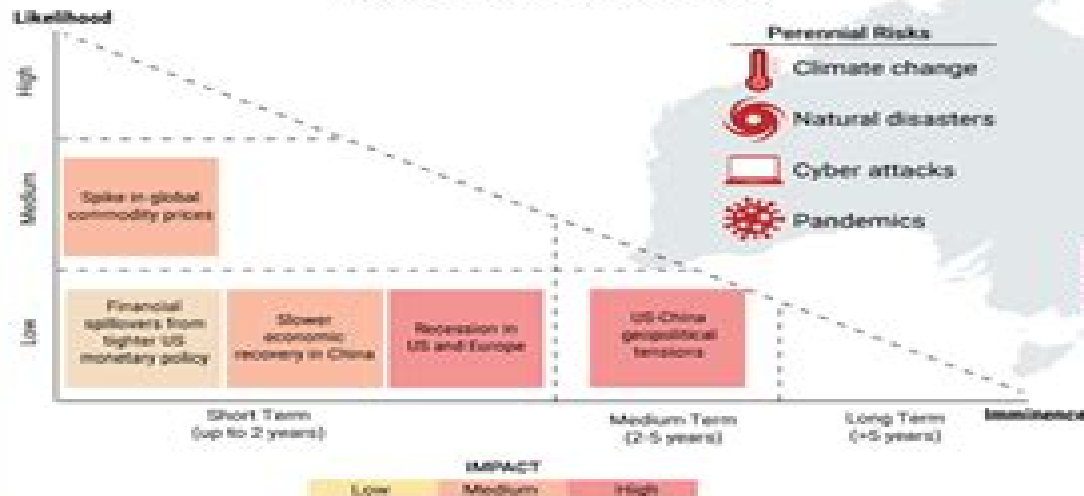

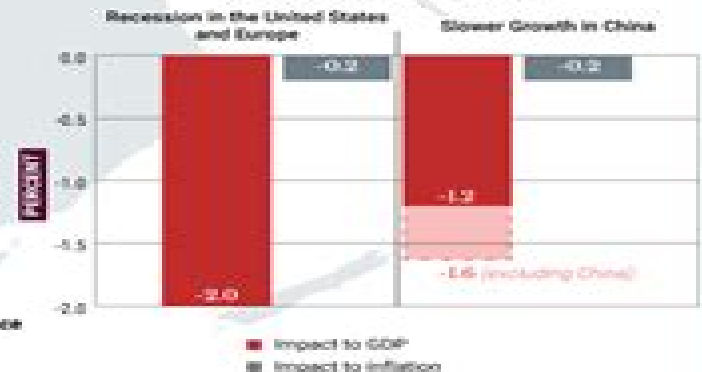
Contribution to Real GDP Growth*
