



Bulla

Circumscribed collection of free fluid, >1 cm



Macule

Circular flat discoloration, <1 cm brown, blue, red or hypopigmented



Nodule

Circular, elevated, solid lesion, >1cm



Patch

Circumscribed flat discoloration, >1cm



Papule

Superficial solid elevated, ≤ 0.5 cm, color varies



Plaque

Superficial elevated solid flat topped lesion, >1 cm



Pustule

Vesicle containing pus (inflammatory cells)



Vesicle

Circular collection of free fluid, ≤ 1 cm



Wheal

Edematous, transitory plaque, may last few hours



Scale

Epidermal thickening: consists of flakes or plates of compacted desquamated layers of stratum corneum



Crust

Dried serum or exudate on skin



Fissure

Crack or split



Excoriation



Erosion



Lichenification
