Each section is devoted to a particular issue in Motor Development and comprises two or more contributions. This volume is to be seen as a companion volume to *Themes in Moto Development* in which the more specific topics presented during the Institute are published. Together the two volumes provide both a general and theme specific approach to this expanding field of knowledge.

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PREFACE Books and conferences on what in North America is euphemistically termed motor development have been few and far between in the past 25 years. This is not to say that the study of how children acquire and develop motor skills has not been a subject on which scientists have focused their attention. In the 1930's and 1940's Bayley 1935 and Gesell and Amatruda 1947 described and scaled the rates at which young children acquired motor skills. Both normal and abnormal development is considered.
