approach that transcends disciplinary boundaries Research on the topic is lagging behind the growth of student numbers and there are many gaps and underexplored areas For example TNE students have rarely been studied from an intercultural communication perspective and international students perceptions of intercultural communication are much less explored than those of faculty and home students Additionally while academic advising has been found to be vital to international student success academic advisers have reported a lack of institutional training on how to deal with international students The actual intercultural interactions of and with international students have rarely been studied in detail Against this background this Research Topic seeks to create interdisciplinary dialogue and cooperation exploring the gaps and underexamined areas of intercultural communication and international students Themes to be addressed include but are not limited to the following language and communication intercultural communication competence and effectiveness intercultural interaction international student experience transnational education TNE internationalization School Life ,1920 The School Journal ,1899 **College Success for Students with Learning Disabilities** Cynthia G.
