TEETH: Cut, crush and tear food.



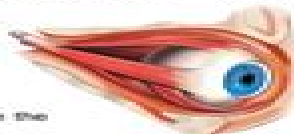
LUNGS: Supplies oxygen to the blood and removes CO₂ from blood.

TONGUE: Help detect and transmit taste signals to the brain. The tongue is vital for chewing and swallowing food, as well as for speech.



THYROID: Controls appetite and metabolism.



BLOOD: Transports oxygen and nutrients around the body and removes cellular waste, among a range of vital functions.



SPLEEN: Helps to filter out toxins in the blood.



STOMACH: Helps in breakage of food.



INTESTINE: Helps to digest the food.



URINARY SYSTEM: Removes wastes from blood, regulates concentration of body fluids.



LIVER: Removes toxins from the blood, produces bile that help in digestion.



GALL BLADDER: Collects bile from the liver, and discharges it into the small intestines, where it helps digest fat.



SKIN: Protects against injury, infection, and fluid loss; helps regulate body temperature and excretes water, as sweat.

MUSCLES: Work with the skeletal and nervous system to produce movement also helps to circulate blood through the human body.



PANCREAS: It has two main functions: an exocrine function that helps in digestion and an endocrine function that regulates blood sugar.
