Man Ray in Paris Erin C. Garcia, Man Ray, 2011 American artist Man Ray spend the most productive years of his career during the 1920s and 1930s in Paris **Man Ray** Janus, Man Ray, 1984 *Man Ray* Man Ray, 2011 When American born Surrealist Man Ray died in 1976 he left behind thousands of photo negatives mostly portraits taken in his studio after his arrival in Paris in 1921 The Centre Georges Pompidou which has owned them since the mid 1990s has duly catalogued the collection of negatives and is now in a position to bring out what is an encyclopedic publication in the best sense of the term It attests both to Man Ray's ability as a portrait photographer and to the quality of his archive as a monument to cultural history The catalog features 500 portraits each of which is explained in a short commentary Since Man Ray's clientele was made up of members of Dadaist and Surrealist circles of artists and painters of writers and US emigrants of the Lost Generation of aristocrats and paragons of the worlds of fashion and theater the book is at the same time a marvelous Who's Who and an indispensable reference work for a broad range of different historians and scholars of the 20th century Man Ray Portraits Man Ray, Terence Pepper, Marina Warner, 2013 Man Ray 1890-1976 was born Michael Emmanuel Radnitzky in Philadelphia and began signing his name as Man Ray in 1912 He initially taught himself photography in order to reproduce his own works of art From 1913 to 1916 Man Ray lived and worked at the artists colony in Ridgefield New Jersey where in 1915 he met the French artist Marcel Duchamp with whom he tried to establish New York Dada Man Ray's friendship with Duchamp led to his moving to Paris in 1921 There as a contributor to the Dada and Surrealist movements Man Ray was perfectly placed to make defining images of his contemporaries from the avant garde Among portraits from the early 1920s featured in this book are remarkable studies of Jean Cocteau Peggy Guggenheim and Gertrude Stein Also included are intimate images of Man Ray's friends and lovers among them Kiki de Montparnasse Alice Prin Lee Miller who helped him discover the printing process of solarisation and Ady Fidelin Also reproduced in *Man Ray Portraits* are some of the artist's less well known later images taken in 1940s Hollywood where he met and married his last muse Juliet Browner His photographs of the 1950s and 1960s include such stars as Leslie Caron and Catherine Deneuve An essential reference guide to Man Ray's life and work this book includes a preface by Terence Pepper and an introduction by Marina Warner as well as more than 200 beautifully reproduced images A detailed illustrated chronology sets Man Ray's work in the context of his life **Man Ray** Man Ray, J. Paul Getty Museum, 1998 On photography of man Ray Man Ray, Photographs, 1920-1934 Man Ray, 1975 **Man Ray** Man Ray, Jed Perl, 1997 I do not photograph nature I photograph my fantasy Man Ray proclaimed and he found in the camera's eye and in light's magical chemistry the mechanisms for dreaming Schooled as a painter and designer in New York Man Ray turned to photography after discovering the 291 Gallery and its charismatic founder Alfred Stieglitz As a young expatriate in Paris during the twenties and thirties Man Ray embraced surrealism and dadaism creeds that emphasized chance effects disjunction and surprise Tireless experimentation with technique led him to employ

solarization grain enlargement mixed media and cameraless prints photograms which he called Rayographs made by placing objects directly on photographic paper and exposing them to light These successful manipulations for which he was dubbed the poet of the darkroom by fellow surrealist Jean Cocteau were a major contribution to twentieth century photography Man Ray was no less adept at commercial and portrait photography and he earned a good living both in Paris and later in Hollywood His portraits of Joyce Eliot Matisse Artaud Hemingway and Brancusi among others testify to his compelling insight Renowned for his exotic wit and elegance Man Ray was one of the most popular figures of his time and his work continues to hold wide appeal Man Ray presents forty three of the greatest images from throughout the artist s career The essay by Jed Perl describes the influences behind Man Ray s abundant career and his enduring contribution to photography

Man Ray 1890 1976 has long been considered one of the most versatile and innovative artists of the twentieth century As a painter writer sculptor photographer and filmmaker he is best known for his intimate association with the French Surrealist group in Paris during the 1920s and 1930s particularly for his highly inventive and unconventional photographic images These remarkable accomplishments however have tended to overshadow the importance of his earlier work significant not only for comprehending Man Ray s future artistic development but also for fleshing out our understanding of the visual arts in America during one of the most important and crucial phases of the evolution of modernism The book and the exhibition for which this work will serve as the catalog concentrate on Man Ray s production from 1907 to 1917 *Conversion to Modernism* will be the first comprehensive fully illustrated work to examine this artist s seminal years The show and the catalog begin with Man Ray s high school years in Brooklyn his studies at the Art Students League and the American Academy in New York and the time he spent in life drawing classes at the more progressive Ferrer Center From 1913 to 1915 Man Ray lived in a small artists colony in Grantwood New Jersey It was here studying with Samuel Halpert a former

student of Matisse that Man Ray began to become the artist we know today The last section of the show and of the book include recently discovered photographs and other works that are influenced by a knowledge of the emergent Dada movement Here is Man Ray in recognizable form just before he leaves the country for France in 1921 This exhibit will first be on display at the Montclair Art Museum from January 26 through March 2003 It will then travel to museums in Athens Georgia Philadelphia and Chicago

Man Ray Man Ray, 2009 One of the most famous artists of the twentieth century a Dadaist and pioneer of Surrealism Man Ray 1890 1976 became involved with photography in 1914 He was soon experimenting with different processes solarization negative images multiple exposures and in 1921 he created the rayograph This volume collects together the best of his experimental work as well as portraits of some of the most important figures in modern art 64 duotone illustrations About the series The classic Photofile series brings together the best work of the world's greatest photographers in an attractive format and at a reasonable price Handsome and collectible the books are produced to the highest standards Each volume contains some sixty full page reproductions
