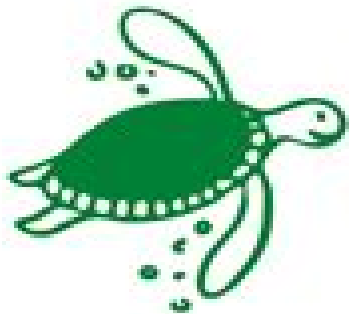


What is Personification?
