Teachers need a clear sense of the changing nature of literacy of the differences between speech and writing and of the characteristic patterns of discourse used in the school subjects they teach. The arguments about literacy are made using examples selected from students writing and textbooks and demonstrate in a pleasing way the benefit to education of some selected linguistic research.
