Knudsen,2008 Secondary education is the final stage of compulsory education preceded by primary education and followed by higher education It is characterised by transition from the typically compulsory comprehensive primary education for minors to the optional selective tertiary post secondary or higher education e g university vocational school for adults Depending on the system schools for this period or a part of it may be called secondary schools high schools gymnasiums lyceums middle schools colleges vocational schools and preparatory schools and the exact meaning of any of these varies between the systems The exact boundary between primary and secondary education varies from country to country and even within them but is generally around the fifth to the tenth year of education Secondary education occurs mainly during the teenage years In the United States and Canada primary and secondary education together are sometimes referred to as K 12 education The purpose of secondary education can be to give common knowledge to prepare for either higher education or vocational education or to train directly for a profession This new book presents the latest research in the field
