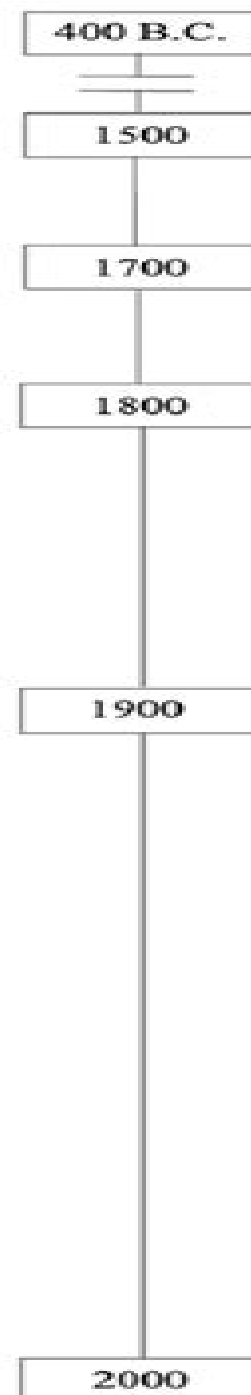


<p>Intensity Theory Plato (c. 428 to 347 B.C.) defined pain as an emotional response to intense stimuli.</p>
<p>Cartesian Dualistic Theory René Descartes (1596-1650) proposed that pain could independently result from psychological factors or physical injury but not synergistically.</p>
<p>Specificity Theory Charles Bell (1774-1842) introduced the brain as an abstract structure that assigns specific input pathways to each of the different sensations.</p>
<p>Johannes Müller (1801-1858) contributed to the specificity theory by associating individual sensations with their respective receptors.</p>
<p>Maximilian von Frey (1852-1932) also advanced the specificity theory by introducing a “pain center” located in the brain that registers the pain signals transmitted from their respective receptors.</p>
<p>Pattern Theory John Paul Nafe (1888-1970) built on the specificity theory by explaining that there are no individual receptors for the four sensory modalities. Instead, each sensation relays a specific pattern of pain impulses to the brain that is then registered.</p>
<p>Gate Control Theory Patrick David Wall (1925-2001) and Ronald Melzack (1929-2019) were the first to introduce pain perception as a mind-body experience. This theory states a neurological gate within the dorsal horn opens in response to painful stimuli. If non-painful stimuli overcome the painful stimuli, the gate will close, and the individual will not experience pain.</p>
<p>Neuromatrix Model Ronald Melzack’s experience with phantom limb pain led to the theory that the origin of pain lies within the CNS rather than relayed through to the PNS.</p>
<p>Biopsychosocial Model John D. Loeser was the first to implement this model. He hypothesized that pain perception resulted in intricate interactions between biological, psychological, and sociological factors.</p>
