Origins and background Sir Arthur Conan Doyle wrote this story shortly after returning to his home Undershaw from South Africa where he had worked as a volunteer physician at the Langman Field Hospital in Bloemfontein at the time of the Second Boer War Conan Doyle had not written about Sherlock Holmes in eight years having killed off the character in the 1893 story The Final Problem Although The Hound of the Baskervilles is set before the latter events two years later Conan Doyle would bring Holmes back for good explaining in The Adventure of the Empty House that Holmes had faked his own death He was assisted with the plot by a 30 year old Daily Express journalist named Bertram Fletcher Robinson 1870 1907 His ideas came from the legend of Richard Cabell which was the fundamental inspiration for the Baskerville tale of a hellish hound and a cursed country squire Cabell s tomb can be seen in the Devon town of Buckfastleigh Squire Richard Cabell lived for hunting and was what in those days was described as a monstrously evil man He gained this reputation for amongst other things immorality and having sold his soul to the Devil There was also a rumour that he had murdered his wife On 5 July 1677 he died and was laid to rest in the sepulchre The night of his interment saw a phantom pack of hounds come baying across the moor to howl at his tomb From that night on he could be found leading the phantom pack across the moor usually on the anniversary of his death If the pack were not out hunting they could be found ranging around his grave howling and shrieking In an attempt to lay the soul to rest the villagers built a large building around the tomb and to be doubly sure a huge slab was placed Moreover Devon s folklore includes tales of a fearsome supernatural dog
