The goal of the book is to review the different case studies and identify common patterns of ecological succession in fallowed swiddens as well as to pinpoint the factors that cause ecological succession in some areas to differ from those in other areas. For this and other economic and political reason governments attempt to curtail shifting cultivation by shortening the years the fields can be left fallow or outright outlawing the farming practice.
