The Congress of Arts and Sciences at St. Louis last summer served to emphasize painfully the present plight of Sociology; for the devotee of the cult made the strange discovery that the further following of his bent threatened violent personal dismemberment. His objects of interest were distributed quite impartially under some six of the seven grand divisions of Science: economics, here; ethnology, there; a thing called "Sociology" hidden under Mental Science, and the things really sociological ranged in a rag-bag and labeled "Social Regulation." And so on.

This document is based on the typewritten, signed manuscript in the W. E. B. Du Bois Papers, Special Collections and Archives section of the W. E. B. Du Bois Library at the University of Massachusetts, Amherst. The manuscript adheres to style conventions prevalent when Du Bois composed it. In particular, it follows the convention of capitalizing key terms, as well as now antiquated rules of punctuation. Except in those very few instances where confusion in meaning is likely, I have decided to preserve the tone of the manuscript by adhering to its original style and have refrained from updating it.
