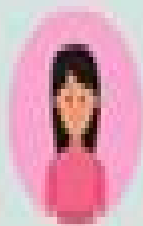
The branch of linguistics that focuses on arranging words and phrases to create well-formed sentences in a language. In English, the basic structure is subject-verb-object (SVO).
