PREFACE Books and conferences on what in North America is euphemistically termed motor development have been few and far between in the past 25 years. This is not to say that the study of how children acquire and develop motor skills has not

been a subject on which scientists have focused their attention. In the United States in the 1930's and 1940's Bayley 1935 and Gesell and Amatruda 1947 described and scaled the rates at which young children acquired motor skills. In Europe the
