It covers a wide range of impairments, disabilities and handicaps commonly seen in young children. It is meant to enable parents to appreciate their manifestations, prevalence and characteristics. The book recognizes the importance of home based programmes and contains lists of more than 400 activities as non formal curriculum for young children. It carries broad guidelines on how to train children for these activities at home or pre school settings.
